6. Programme Structure

Notes:

(1) Each student will study two optional modules, one at Level 5 (third year) and one at Level 6 (final year).

(2) A module passed at one level cannot be repeated even if offered at a different level.

(3) Certain modules will only run in alternate years at Levels 5 & 6, as indicated below by “E” for a module running only in 2022-23 and subsequent even-numbered academic years and “O” for a module running only in 2023-24 and subsequent odd-numbered academic years. Students should be aware that not every module will be available in both Year 3 and Final Year of their study programme and should plan to study each module when it is available, identifying their options for both years of study, and remembering that one study year will be “Even” and the other “Odd”. See examples in Appendix.

(4) A student interrupting for any reason including a placement year would typically need to change pathway to BSc (Hons) Maritime Business to avoid repeating modules already studied.

10 Progression routes/criteria for final and intermediate awards

Students enrolled on BSc (Hons) Maritime Business with Foundation (7067) who pass all modules of Level 3 (Foundation Year) will automatically progress directly onto Level 4 (Year 1) of BSc (Hons) Maritime Business (7063). Students who pass all modules of Level 3 can progress to Level 4 of any other programme within Plymouth Business School upon request.

Students are required to pass all modules of Level 3 (Foundation Year) to progress directly onto Level 4 (Year 1) of BSc (Hons) Maritime Business.

Students must achieve 120 credits at Level 3 to progress to Level 4. There is no exit award for those leaving after Level 3.

Certificate of Higher Education – achieved through completion of 120 Level 4 credits.
Diploma of Higher Education - achieved through completion of 120 Level 4 credits and 120 Level 5 credits.

In advance of programme reapproval input was garnered from alumni, employers, and current students directed by international consultancy to ensure our offer is future-focused for graduate success in employment and further study in the post Covid-19 world.
